

# Professional Responsibility in Education

**Workplace Setting:** Rocky Mountain School District (K-12)

**Audience:** First-Year Teachers

**Topic:** Professional Responsibility in Education

**Delivery Format:** Virtual Onboarding Training

## Rationale for Using Social Learning Theory

This virtual onboarding program is based on Social Learning Theory (SLT), which emphasizes learning through observation, interaction, and modeling (Salem Press Encyclopedia of Health, 2024). Since professional responsibility is shaped by real-world experiences and ethical decision-making, SLT provides a strong foundation for helping first-year teachers understand and apply district policies in practical ways.

By engaging in case study discussions, peer interactions, and reflective activities, teachers can observe best practices, analyze ethical challenges, and reinforce learning through collaboration. SLT also supports self-efficacy, helping new teachers build confidence in handling professional responsibilities through guided learning and social reinforcement. This approach ensures that professional responsibility is not just learned, but practiced and internalized in a meaningful way.

## Overview & Purpose

- This virtual onboarding session introduces first-year teachers to professional responsibilities, ethical decision-making, and school policies.
- The session will ensure that new teachers understand state ethics codes, social media guidelines, and appropriate professional boundaries.

## Learning Objectives

By the end of this session, participants will be able to:

1. Identify key elements of professional responsibility and ethics in teaching.
2. Analyze real-world scenarios related to teacher conduct and decision-making.
3. Apply district policies and ethical guidelines to various teaching situations.
4. Engage in reflective discussions to enhance professional judgment.

### **Icebreaker Activity: “Ethics in Action” (10 min)**

#### **Description:**

- Participants engage in an interactive poll where they anonymously vote on ethical scenarios teachers might face.
- After voting, the instructor facilitates a discussion based on responses and connects them to real-world guidelines.

#### **Implementation Steps:**

1. Scenario Presentation: Display an ethical scenario.
2. Anonymous Poll: Participants vote using Mentimeter.
3. Facilitated Discussion:
  - Review poll results and discuss varying perspectives.
  - Introduce related state policies & district guidelines.
  - Encourage participants to share thoughts & experiences.

#### **Objective:**

- Create early engagement in ethical decision-making.
- Encourage collaborative learning and discussion-based reflection.

### **Why Professional Responsibility Matters (10 min)**

#### **Activity: “Why It Matters” Mini Case Walkthrough**

This section introduces the importance of professional responsibility by highlighting real-world impacts and ethical expectations for teachers. Rather than another interactive poll, this activity provides context and discussion before moving into the deeper case study analysis.

#### **Implementation Steps:**

1. Brief Presentation (5 min)

- Define professional responsibility in teaching (trust, ethics, legal considerations).
  - Discuss why ethical conduct is critical for student well-being, school culture, and professional reputation.
  - Highlight real-world consequences (e.g., teacher suspensions, legal issues, community backlash).
  - Walk through one anonymized or real case where a teacher violated professional standards and discuss the outcome.
2. Facilitated Group Reflection (5 min)
- Pose an open-ended discussion question:  
*“What are the biggest professional challenges teachers face today, and how can understanding ethical guidelines help navigate them?”*
  - Participants share responses via chat or quick verbal input before transitioning to the case study section.

**Objective:**

- Provide real-world relevance to ethical decision-making.
- Ensure teachers understand the impact of professional conduct on their careers and students.
- Foster discussion without redundancy, leading into the case study section.

**Case Study Scenarios: Ethical Dilemmas in Teaching (20 min)**

**Activity:** Participants engage in small breakout discussions to analyze real-world ethical dilemmas, applying professional guidelines to hypothetical teacher scenarios.

**Implementation Steps:**

1. Scenario Presentation – Display an ethical dilemma related to teacher-student boundaries, confidentiality, or social media use.
2. Group Discussion – In breakout rooms, participants discuss the scenario, apply the state code of ethics, and propose appropriate responses.
3. Facilitated Debrief – The instructor reviews key takeaways and aligns responses with best practices and professional standards.

**Example Scenarios:**

- A parent emails a teacher requesting confidential student information.
- A teacher posts about students on personal social media.
- A staff member observes a colleague making inappropriate comments about students.

**Objective:** Reinforce ethical decision-making and peer modeling of appropriate professional behavior.

**State Code of Professionalism & School Policies (10 min)**

**Activity:** Teachers review key sections of the state's code of ethics and district policies on teacher conduct, confidentiality, and reporting obligations.

**Implementation Steps:**

1. Handout Review – Participants receive a PDF of the state code of ethics and key district policies.
2. Instructor Q&A – The facilitator highlights essential policies and answers participant questions.

**Objective:** Ensure teachers understand and can apply professional responsibility guidelines in their schools.

### **Final Reflection & Next Steps (10 min)**

**Activity:** Participants complete a Google Docs reflection, summarizing key takeaways and setting personal action steps.

**Implementation Steps:**

1. Reflection Prompt: *What is one key ethical principle that stood out to you today, and how will you apply it in your role?*
2. Group Share: Volunteers share insights from their reflections.
3. Follow-Up Resources: The facilitator provides access to an optional discussion board for continued peer interaction.

**Objective:** Reinforce key learning points and encourage continued engagement with professional ethics.
